

Forever 27 and Forever 48 are videos that fantasize about what the deceased musicians Kurt Cobain and Whitney Houston, respectively, would be like if they were still alive in 2013 and in the prime of their youth. The artist used early open-source face-swapping software to graft the original stars' faces onto those of hired actors, but because this happens in real time, the effect is imperfect and glitchy, with the actors' faces sometimes breaking through the illusion.

These videos take the form of prime-time television interviews and highlight the disposability of creative workers, whose careers are predicated on their youth. Seamlessly merging excerpted transcripts of actual interviews with original scripted dialogue, they present Cobain and Houston not as icons who died tragically before their time, but rather as burned-out eternally young has-beens. Here, as with many other works from his *Creative Labor* series, Kline examines the function of celebrity in our society.

For this series of images, Kline meticulously composited, pixel-by-pixel, photographs he found on the internet of 1990s celebrities with those from two decades later. By combining the recently young with the currently young-Kurt Cobain with Ariel Pink, Björk with Nicki Minaj, Johnny Depp with James Franco-Kline suggests that rather than unique individuals, celebrities are actually stock characters, replaced with each passing generation by someone who serves the same role, shares the same facial features, and even behaves similarly. These works interrogate youth culture, trend cycles, and the limited shelf life and ultimate disposability of people in the creative sector. Made during the rise of social media, as personal branding spread beyond the realm of celebrity, Kline's series raises questions about what exactly one aspires toward when chasing fame.

In the years since Kline made these works, Depp, Franco, and Pink have all been accused of sexual abuse.

Kline's large wall tapestry is created out of the Nano Puff® fabric used to make one of Patagonia's most popular jackets. Made in collaboration with the company and first presented in 2012 at MoMA PS1, the work touches on what was then a fashion trend in the art world. At the time, Kline anticipated that many of the visitors to the exhibition would be wearing such Patagonia jackets. Today, Patagonia's outerwear is a wardrobe staple for the tech industry.

Like the other work in *Creative Labor*, here Kline uses fashion to implicate the viewer in the dynamics he addresses, namely how taste and consumption can serve as markers of identity. For Kline, taste—especially in fashion, music, architecture, design, or art—has become commodified in the age of social media, replacing individualism as a desirable trait. By sheathing the gallery in high-tech fashion, the artist suggests that clothing is a kind of wearable personal architecture.

This video from Kline's installation *Freedom* (2014) imagines the people responsible for the 2003 Iraq War—then US President George W. Bush; his cabinet members Dick Cheney, Condoleezza Rice, and Donald Rumsfeld; and then UK Prime Minister Tony Blair—in a political fantasy about accountability, justice, and contrition that will likely never come to pass.

Predating Al-generated deepfakes by only a few years, the early open-source face-swapping software Kline used here allowed him to replace his actors' faces with those of the politicians they played. The software applies a mask over the actor in real time which often leads to glitches, occasionally breaking the illusion to reveal the faces of the unfamiliar actors beneath.

In 2011, Kline took part in the Occupy Wall Street movement and attended protests. There, enabled by the increased surveillance powers granted by the controversial 2001 Patriot Act, police officers clad in SWAT gear used video cameras to record the faces of peaceful protestors. These imposing sculptures, three of which take their names from the NYPD slogan "Courtesy, Professionalism, Respect," were made a few years later, during the 2014 racial justice protests in New York, where activists were also heavily surveilled using equipment purchased to detect and prevent terrorism. The works take their forms from the main characters in the children's television show *Teletubbies* a group of oversized technologically augmented creatures with video screens embedded in their bellies. On the show, the Teletubbies enjoy watching footage of regular people going about their lives, making this (admittedly fictional) invasion of privacy look fun.

The Police Teletubbies contain screens showing *Privacy*, a video in which police officers assume the identities of activists through early digital face-swapping technology. In the video, the police wear the activists' faces and clothes and read from scripts derived from the activists' social-media feeds, a mixture of political speech and personal content. Kline's project asks: In a world where political discourse takes place on corporate social media, what are the possibilities for democratic change? These works are part of *Freedom* (2014), the first chapter of Kline's ongoing installation cycle.
