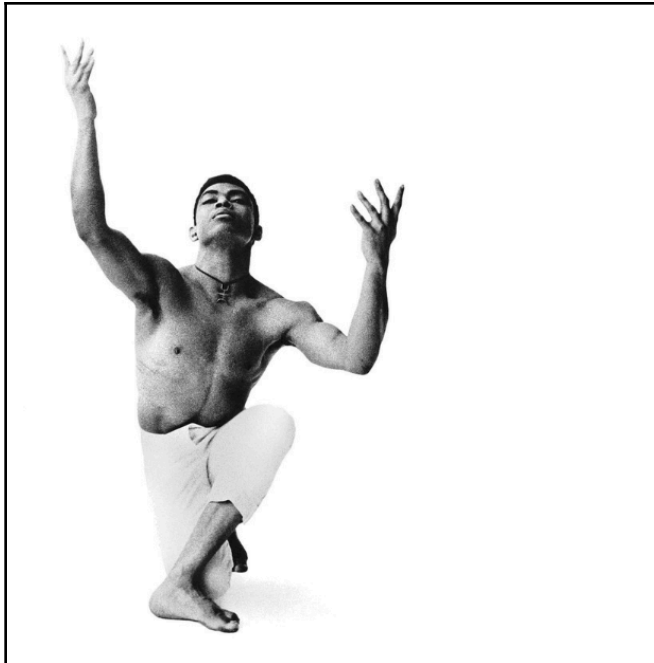


Carl Van Vechten, *Alvin Ailey*, 1955.

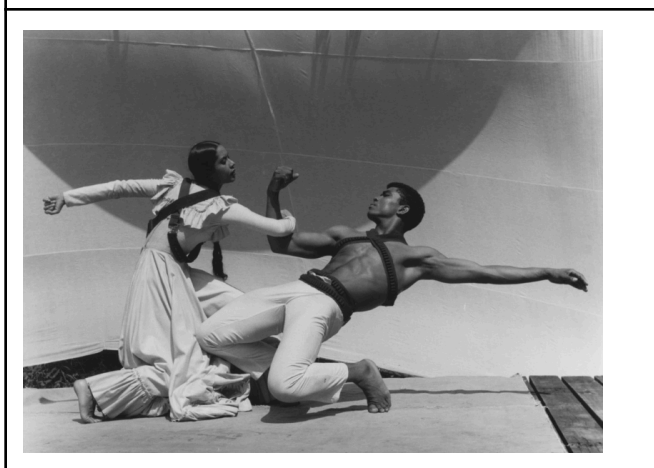

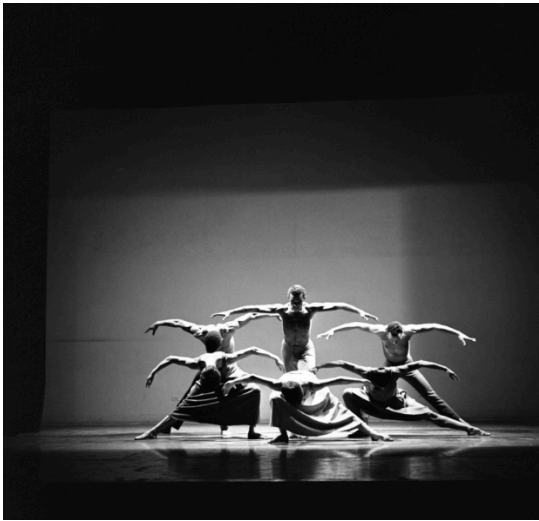
