Through repetition and endurance, the performance reveals the absurdity of a system that demands constant movement and tries to outrun inevitable breakdowns. *cat got your tongue* is a new durational performance by Asia Stewart, whose conceptual work centers the body as a living archive. Through the seemingly trivial task of walking on a desk treadmill and chewing gum at the same time, Stewart draws our attention to the exploitative logic of capitalism in its constant pursuit of efficiency as well as the valorised commodification of wellness. Over the course of the performance she undertakes to test the limits of both her own body and the machine itself, pushing against the expectation that productivity should be continuous and unchallenged. *cat got your tongue* ultimately presents her refusal of efficiency.
